

The Department of Public Works is currently working on the design and implementation of a crosswalk on Little Creek Road.

The crosswalk will be located between the 64 exit ramp and San Antonio Boulevard. Installation is expected to be completed by

February 2009.

Outcome	Status
Surveillance Cameras	 Locations are set at Fort Worth, Galveston, and San Antonio. Electrical metering configuration is underway, installation begins in November. Dominion Power connects electrical to make poles ready for video/radio installation. Video/radio configuration installed and servers tested at the City. First cameras placed on pole and tested in December. Remaining cameras installed during the month of December.



Special Service Area Update in the Denby Park Area

Norfolk Redevelopment & Housing Authority and the City of Norfolk have several loan and grant programs to help you create a "new home" look and feel. The 4 programs are: The Norfolk Home Rehabilitation Program for homeowners, the Residential Façade and Aesthetic Improvement Grant Program that provides a matching grant up to \$15,000 for multi-family housing, the Model Home Demonstration Program that provides a matching loan for room additions and finally the Neighborhood Street Stabilization Program which provides for infrastructure improvements. To date, a total of 55 residents have contacted NRHA regarding the new residential improvement programs. For more information Please contact: Judy. K Haller, 314-2085.

Second Patrol Pro-Active Enforcement Activities

On May 5, 2008 a bicycle patrol unit was established working daily during the hours of 7:00 p.m.—3:30 a.m.. The unit focuses on violent crime along the East Little Creek Road corridor between the 300-2400 blocks. Enforcement actions for the reporting period include:

- 3 Felony Arrests
- 37 Misdemeanor Arrests
- 5 Field Interviews
- Evidence Recovered—Crack Cocaine (\$10 value), Heroin (\$300 value), Marijuana (\$160 value) and 2 weapons.



Block Watch is a program of neighbors watching out for neighbors. Thanks to our "Watchers" a burglary was stopped in October with an arrest made.

There are over 20 members of the Denby Park Block Watch team. Block Watch members would like to advise you to be safe and always keep a watchful eye on your surroundings during this holiday season.
